

Price is about right, so it's unlikely I'll be betting. Super Seth has a solid base of ratings from which to make the step to this level. He'll race on pace which gives him an edge over the Shark, so it becomes a matter of how aggressively you want to price him. I've more or less sat on the fence, and have both the main chances around their market price. Good race but not really a betting proposition for me.
